Knowledge gain – They'll pick up key facts about HIV transmission, prevention, testing and treatment just by reading the designs and the accompanying info panels.</li><li>2. Critical thinking – Figuring out how to translate a health message into a visual theme pushes them to analyze and synthesize information in a creative way.</li><li>3. Teamwork &amp; collaboration – Working in groups to plan and execute a rangoli teaches coordination, sharing responsibilities, and appreciating diverse ideas.</li><li>4. Communication skills – When they explain their design to judges or the public, they practice articulating complex health concepts in simple, engaging language.</li><li>5. Empathy &amp; reduced stigma – Seeing the human side of HIV through art helps them develop compassion and a more inclusive attitude toward people living with HIV.</li></ol>
